



## Christmas Snowflakes






# Snowflakes

Try these five different snowflake activities with your students.

## *Paper Snowflakes*

Fold white paper in  $\frac{1}{2}$ , and then in  $\frac{1}{2}$  again, keeping the folded edges together.

Then fold over into a triangle. Cut an arc or design on the outside edges (this gives the shape of the snowflake).

Then cut triangles or designs into the folded edges.

Unfold paper carefully.

Decorate with glitter.

## *Coffee Filter Snowflakes*

**Materials Needed** (coffee filters, brightly colored markers, newspaper, scissors, spray bottles)

Round coffee filters are easy for younger children.

Color the coffee filters with markers. (Make sure to use markers, not pencil crayons or crayons so that colors will 'run' when wet – see below)

Allow children to color freely.

When children are finished coloring, transfer snowflakes onto newspaper and spray with water. (Children can tap little drops of water onto snowflakes, spray with spray bottle etc. in order to apply water to filters.)

Filters are very durable and will dry quickly.

Fold and cut out shapes for snowflake. (see above)



Tips:

- ✓ Use brightly colored markers only
- ✓ Younger children might need help with cutting

## *Textured Snowflakes*

Use Honeycomb Cereal and glue it onto blue paper.

## *Glue Snowflakes*

### **Materials:**

Squeeze white glue, wax paper, glitter.

### **Method:**


First, children draw a snowflake onto the wax paper to the best of their abilities. Then, children squeeze glue over the design.

If child's hand is not strong enough, provide hand over hand assistance.

Allow them to sprinkle or pour glitter over their snowflake.

Let it dry. Then gently peel it from the wax paper.

Hang snowflakes around the room and children will have a winter snowflake wonderland.



## *Snowflake Jars*

### **Materials:**

Baby food jars, sparkling glitter, snowflake confetti/pieces, water.

### **Method:**

Let children place everything in the jar.

Then an adult hot glues the lid and places it onto the jar.

Children will have their own snowflake shakers.
